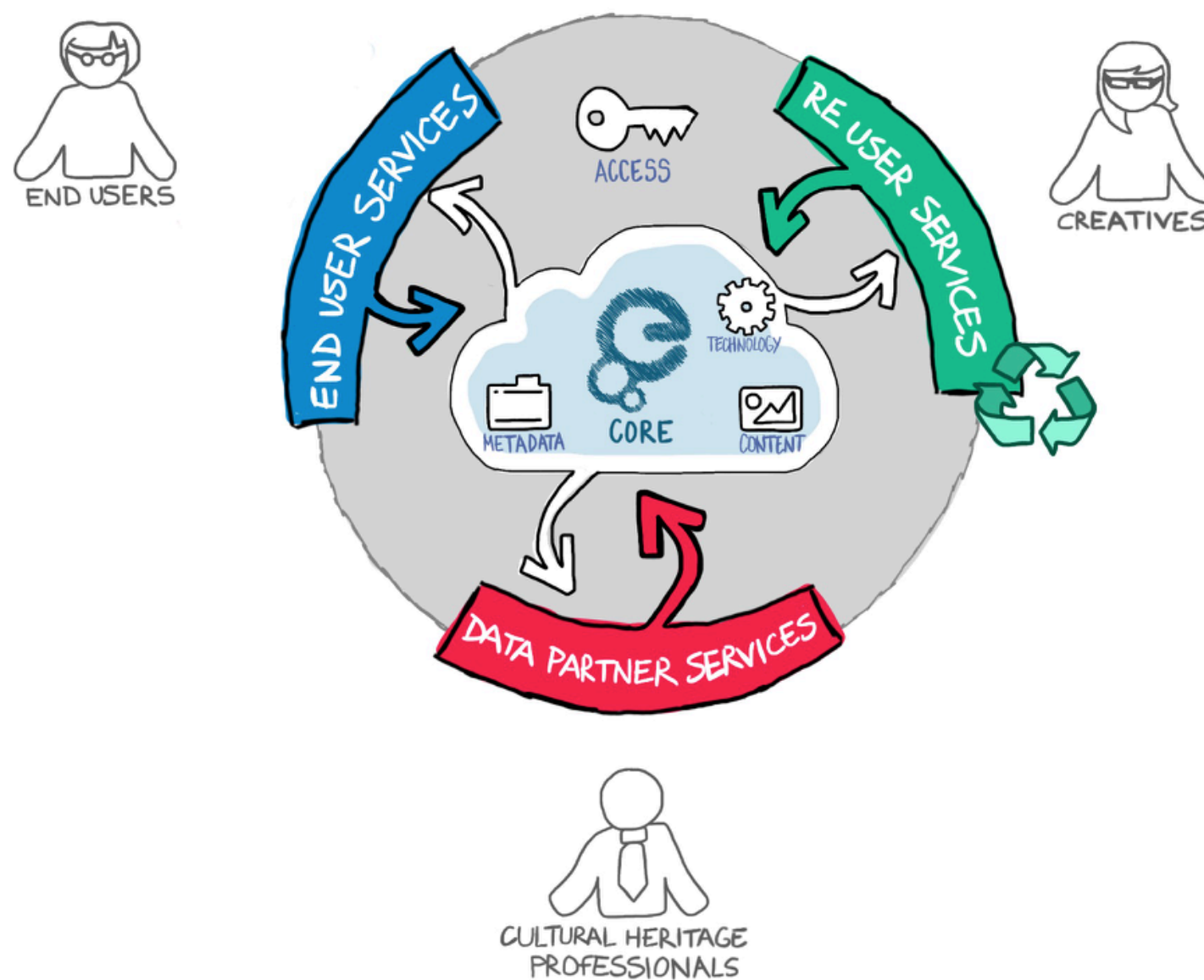
Ten years of Europeana

April 2005	Jacques Chirac's tells EC his big idea
2007	EDLnet starts building Europeana
November 2008	Europeana prototype launched
Summer 2010	Prototype becomes a service
September 2012	Europeana metadata released as CC0
May 2015	Europeana Digital Service Infrastructure

Ten years of Europeana

- >3,700 institutions share their collections online
- >52 millions of records available
- CC0 for metadata
- Standardised rich data model (EDM)
- All records include a rights statement

- Mechanism through which a consortium of partners in the Network Association can work together

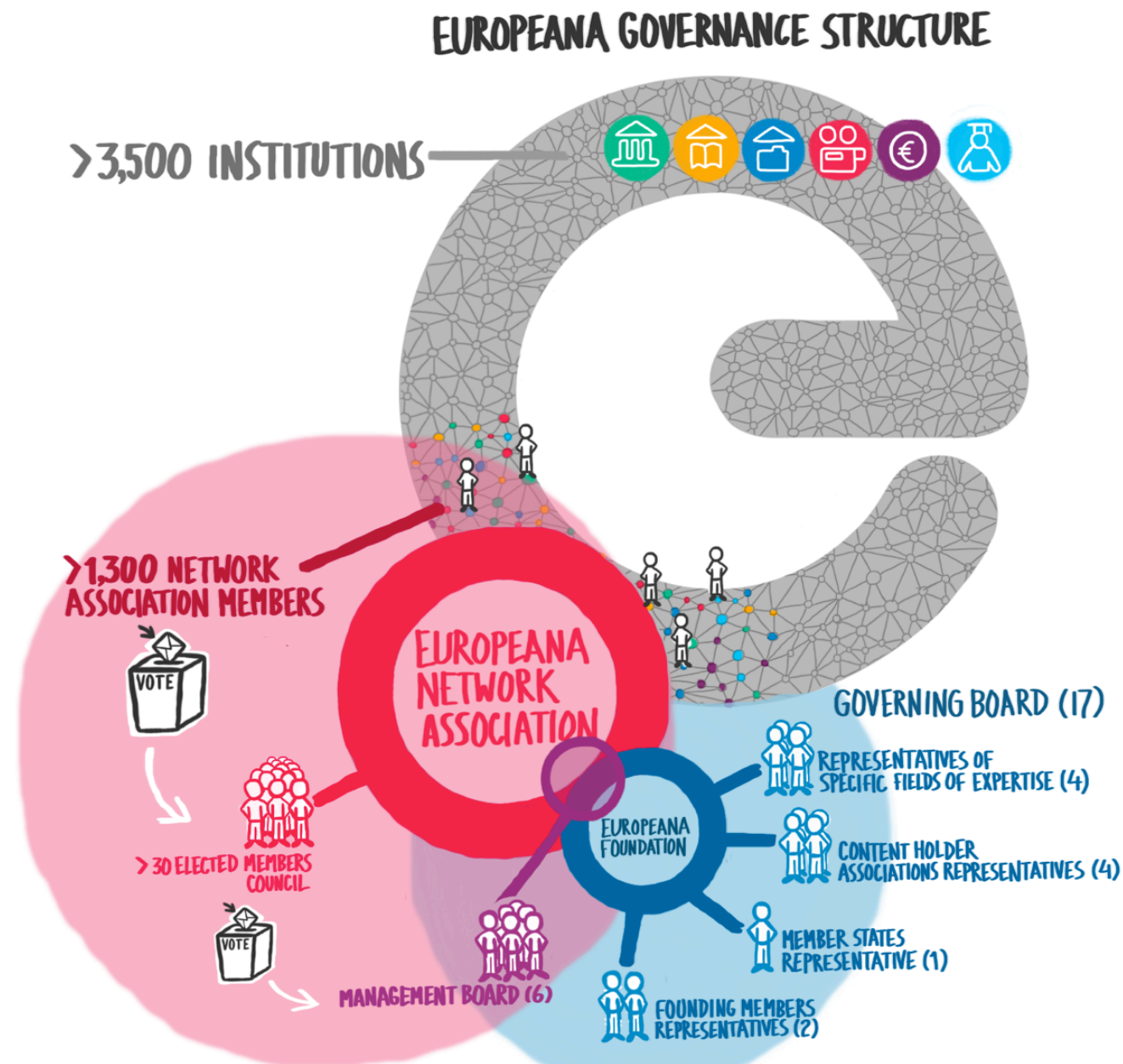


